

**GRASS LAKE CHARTER TOWNSHIP  
APPROVED WORK SESSION MEETING MINUTES  
May 26, 2020**

The following meeting was held electronically using Zoom. Notices were posted on the Townships website, Facebook and front door.

**Board Members Present by Roll Call:** Stormont, Bednarski-Lynch, Bray, Zenz, Loveland joined at 8:07 and Butterfield joined at 8:03. Absent: Brennan. Others in attendance: Steve Bisard, Officer Shackelford, Jim Howe, Chief Jones and Assessor DeBoe.

**Meeting** called to order via Zoom by Supervisor Stormont at 8:00 am.

**The Township** has been receiving complaints on very strong odors, large service upgrades to buildings. Steve Bisard and Officer Shackelford spoke on this. Care givers can grow 72 plants. Odor is controlled by the State. Medical Marijuana will be phased out by the State this year. Recreational can still happen. Plan Reviews are required for services 400 amp or greater. Black market growers will most likely still happen.

**Foreclosure on Delinquent Parcels** – A resolution by the Township Board is needed for this. Loveland is to look more into this.

**Office Protocol when re-opening the Township Office** – Zenz had received an opening schedule from another Township in the State, Bednarski-Lynch has reviewed and made some mark ups, Zenz will get to board members before the June Meeting. Updates will happen as needed. Currently the Stay at Home Order goes until June 12. The June regular Township Board Meeting will be held by Zoom.

**Recreation Board Update**– Howe stated Jackson County Parks are having no organized sports. He will work with Bray to get signs up at park and also to mail out letters to Trackside Tornado's as they have not attended the last two Recreation Board Meetings. Summer Youth League is reimbursing the Township for 1/3 of the cost of new sink in the concession building. Renegades will donate the faucet. 1<sup>st</sup> treatment of weed preventor and fertilizer has been applied to the fields.

**Road Millage** – Bray wants to know who we contact to get information together to start getting out to the residents about the upcoming road millage. Wants it to happen sooner than later.

**Election Update** – Zenz wants board to be thinking about how to safely hold election for voting in person.

**Motion** by Bray and supported by Butterfield to adjourn the Work Session at 9:05 am. Motion Carried.
